



ORBITAL TUMORS

ORBITAL TUMORS or inflammation can occur behind the eye and often push the eye forward causing a prominent and protruded eye (proptosis) and include the following causes.

Signs/ Symptoms of ORBITAL TUMORS

- Dimness of Vision
- Double Vision
- Cosmetic concern due to bulging eyes
- Red Eyes
- Watery and Painful Eyes

Causes of ORBITAL TUMORS

- Lymphoma
- Dermoid
- Lacrimal gland tumours
- Vascular tumours (hemangioma or lymphangioma)

Treatment of ORBITAL TUMORS

Orbitotomy with subsequent treatment. Whenever possible, orbital tumors need to be totally excised and sent for biopsy.

Some tumors may need chemotherapy or radiotherapy for adjuvant treatment. In some advanced tumors, it may be necessary to proceed with removal of eye & orbital contents (enucleation).

After a thorough examination and CT imaging, the concern can be addressed to cure and through a decent cosmetic approach leaving minimal to no after surgery visible scars.
